- Completely updated road maps for southwestern B.C. with road classifications from rough roads to divided highways (including thousands of miles of serviced logging and back roads on Vancouver Island & the Lower Mainland compiled in collaboration with B.C. Forest Service);
- City core maps of Vancouver, Victoria, Nanaimo, Courtenay-Comox, Campbell River, Powell River and Whistler with street names, tourist highlights and ferry access information;
- Locations of Provincial Parks with a comprehensive index of access information, operating dates, reservation systems, hiking trails and recreational activities plus detailed maps of the major Parks showing park highlights, facilities locations, and campsite layouts to facilitate ease of making reservations (this has been a highly requested feature for some time);
- Pacific Rim National Park Reserve (Long Beach, Broken Group Islands, West Coast Trail) with contact and camping information, Gulf Islands National Park Reserve and National Historic Sites;
- Beautiful full colour photographs of some of B.C.'s Parks;
- Locations of BC Forest Service recreation (camping) sites (most are situated on rivers or lakes);
- Major ski areas with trails, lifts, amenities, opening dates, length of season, annual snowfall, driving directions as well as contact information;
- Best places to fish with access instructions, fishing tips, species information and stocking details;
- Wildlife viewing locations with species highlights, best time of year for viewing, facilities available at the site, and access information;
- Complete listing of all ferry services and schedules plus suggested Island circle tour itineraries by BC Ferries.

Unlike other travel resources on the market, the **Southwestern British Columbia Road & Recreational Atlas** is specially designed for ease of use. It has a 4,000 names index of places and geographic features with an easy to understand page grid reference system, making finding a location on the maps extremely simple.

To ensure accuracy, this Atlas was compiled in collaboration with BC Parks, Parks Canada, Freshwater Fisheries Society of BC, BC Ferries, Ministry of Water, Land & Air Protection and BC Forest Service.
